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“Valpolicella Classica”DOCG

The Valpolicella wine region, located in the Veneto region of northeastern Italy, produces some of Italy's most famous red wines from the Corvina, Rondinella and Molinara grapes.

Wines with the Valpolicella DOC label are fresh and cherry-flavored, with a slightly bitter finish. These light-bodied reds are great accompaniments to foods that might be overwhelmed by heavier reds, and they can be chilled slightly to enjoy in warm weather. The more intense Valpolicella Superiore wines are 1 percent higher in alcohol and are aged for at least a year. Those labeled Valpolicella Classico are generally considered to be of the highest quality. They come from a designated area in the heart of the Valpolicella region, where the grapes are grown on steep terraces.
